- Three Consultants secured: Project Management (Becky Bey), Assessment (Katie Loveland), Planning (Jane Smilie and Katie Loveland)
- Community Assessment Completed
- Planning began with conference: Part I: July 16-17 (110 attendees). Part II coming: September 4-5
 - Planning method: *Sequential Intercept Mapping (SIM)*. The SIM process will result in comprehensive plan for prevention, behavioral health/treatment, and criminal justice collaboration to reduce drug-related crime and addiction.
- Plan to be completed by December 2019
- Three grants for future funding submitted: 1) Request for continued funds from HIDTA (source: Office of National Drug Control Policy - ONDCP) to strengthen the coalition and implement the plan; 2) Partnership for Success grant (source: Substance Abuse Mental Health Services Administration-SAMHSA) to increase targeted prevention efforts in the schools, and Substance Use treatment for youth identified through Billings schools; 3) Drug Free Communities grant (source: SAMHSA and ONDCP) to strengthen coalition prevention efforts aimed at youth 18 and under. Efforts inclusive of schools, parents, youth, faith community, enforcement, media, non profits, treatment, and business.
